

RIPA Offers Virtual Courses on the History of the Association and Key Legal / Regulatory Issues

Part I of the course will introduce RIPA, from its founding in 1943 to the present. We will talk about the various programs and regulatory compliance materials offered by the association, most of which are available on the web site. Part II will introduce members to the wide range of legal and regulatory compliance issues that the association deals with on a regular basis, from the empty container rule to closure instructions, testing and employee training.
